

Dear Coaches:

IS BASEBALL HEADING FOR THE SETTING SUN? By now I'm sure most all of you baseball coaches know that baseball has had limitations put upon it. These limitations are the most extreme of any sport program in the I.H.S.A.A.. Baseball has gone to a seven week playing season! Many people ask why? I don't have the answer other than to say that many of the States Athletic Directors wanted limitations on all sports.

How did baseball survive for so many years without these type of restrictions? A seven week program and 20 playing dates.

Let's take a look at what has happened over the past couple months. The Baseball Advisory Board and the Coaches Associations suggested that no limitations should be put on--that it should be a local option. The Advisory Board did say--if you must limit baseball do so by playing dates, not games.

A joint committee of I.G.H.S.A.U. & the I.H.S.A.A. compiled a survey that they sent out to all the schools. The results of this survey can be found in the newsletter. Let me comment on this survey. The only time you could express a feeling towards any additional comments was when you answered yes. The survey should have been in two part I. Simple! Do you favor placing a limitation on the baseball season:

YES NU

407 returned the survey and said they participated in summer baseball. The first question asked was: Do you favor limitation or should it be local option of each school district. If you answered you favored a limitation, you got to go on to Question C. It you answered no you HAD NO VOTE ON C. 123 had no vote on the next question, which means 30 % of the people had no vote!

PARI II. If the schools in lowa favor limitation which of the following would you prefer. Then give more than two options.

QUESTION C: Only two dates were given as choices: a/ At the conclusion of the District Irack Meet or b/ At the conclusion of the State Track Meet. Why not a starting date of April 15 or May I also? Why should the District Track of State Track Meet dictate a starting time for baseball? 203 answered a/ and 45 b/

QUESTION D: Should there be a starting date for competition in summer baseball established? 249 said Yes, we favor a limitation and 118 said no, it should be a local option of each school district. Again, if you answer positive to the questionnaire you got to go on an answer # E. 118 did not get to answer E. This is again around 30 % that had no vote in E.

UESTION F: Should there be a maximum number of palying dates established in summer by ball? 264 answered Yes, we favor a limitation and lu4 said no, they favored local op on. Again if you answered yes you got to continue on to vote on a number of playing dates.

I teel this poll was very biased on the number of options restricted, and over 30% of people did not have a vote on any of the options. We are supposed to be educators, and yet we have this kind or poll conducted.

How much imput did the base ball coach have in the poll? From what I understand very little. I assume every coach in the state is a professional in his sport he coaches. Why no imput? The coaches association and advisory board were both against these type of restrictions.

We can live with guide lines or starting dates., but they should be reasonable ones, and not ones that are extreme!

How many boys will be able to get college scholarships on a 7 week program? They are competing for these with boys from other states. Will the Iowa boy have the same opportunity as everyone else? How many Iowa boys will be drafted by the pro's? Very few if any!

The schools that already have spring baseball have success in student participation. (Which is what high school athletics is suppose to be all about). Here at Washington High School in Cedar Rapids we have over 50 boys out for baseball; for 90% of these boys, baseball is their only sport. It becomes a long winter waiting for their favorite sport. We can't play year round like someother sports! Will we have that many boys showing up for baseball if we have a later starting date? A lot of them will get jobs and never come out, others will forsake baseball for softball in the city, or other summer recreational programs in the summer.

I feel baseball should have the same opportunity as other sports on having students during the school day for practice and some games! It is important to the participants in any sport—to have the identification or recognition by their peers during the school year! A real problem is starting late is the players will go out and startice by themselves and what habits may will learn is not predictable. In fact bad and the of throwing, hitting, etc will be the rule. Also—waiting that long tries the patience of all of us. Will it lead to violations of the rule itself? It would seem that the rule encourages such violations. It will be very difficult to explain and to justify such a rule to participants who are egar to play. We are not talking about law breakers, but truly interested kids.

The spring time of the year is when coaches do most of their teaching of fundamentals. If the lack of learning fundamentals is a reason to place limitations, if this is a problem it is not a local problem the same as an in-effictive class room teacher? What will a late starting date do? It is the starting that professional base ball calls for 4-6 weeks of training before the season begins and we get 8 days. How much can a single coach teach in such a period? If the program would start in April with fundamentals and starting of games Mayl or the second Saturday in May and run through the start of the State Tournament it would give Iowa a real quality baseb all program! This would amount to 3 to 4 weeks of practice and 11-12 weeks of baseball, and around 25 playing dates. This would compare to the basketball season in length.

It is difficult to play a large number of boys when a game limitation is on the school. The size of squad should have some bearing on number of games or dates. We have a different problem at Washington than does a small school, but we have the same restrictions. There are several factors that the survey forgot to take into account. Does your school have Lights? How many boys are out for baseball? How many people will not show for 4:00/6:00 doubleheader-especially true of natural rivialries. To make money there should be single-games at a time when fans will come. Make them doubleheader and both schools lose a good gate.

What can we do to let people know they made a mistake! We can talk to our principal and Athletic Directors! Have your local school boards express themselves if they feel local option should be important, or reasonable starting dates and reasonable number of playing dates.

Why did Iowa go to summer baseball in the first place? Was it not for the reasons that aseball is a summer sport? You can play lots of games? And many more reasons for the summer programs were given. Now what are they saying?

I just can't see where these limitations can help improve the baseball program of Iowa. I have coached 24 years, and we have taken a real step backward! Why do people in positions to make rules always like to cut the things player/ students like to do? I would rather have them out on a baseball diamond and involved in a baseball game rather than hanging out at a drug party, driving all around in a car, or drinking at a party, or even working 28 hours a week.
