At Gahanna Lincoln High School, Brad Mullin was involved in sports, academic extracurriculars and community service organizations. He sampled many languages and was an active member of the *Lion's Roar* staff. In Key Club, National Honor Society and American Government Day he participated in community service. But his sights were set on medicine and following top twenty graduation, he enrolled at Otterbein College.

At Otterbein, his goals took a more direct course. There he was recognized as an Otterbein Scholar, was awarded the Alumni Memorial Scholarship and received Sara B. Mauger Scholar recognition. He was inducted in Phi Eta Sigma as a freshman and became a member of the science honorary Sigma Zeta, The Otterbein (Academic) Scholars Torch and Key, the Pre-med society Alpha Epsilon Delta and also Landacre Research Society. He studied at the University of South Alabama in marine science during the summer session of 1981. As an undergraduate at Otterbein, Brad was a laboratory assistant/teaching assistant/ tutor in the departments of chemistry and life science and in 1982 he was a phlebotomist at Grant Hospital. Brad graduated Magna Cum Laude from Otterbein College in 1984 and was accepted into The Ohio State University School of Medicine.

During his four years of medical studies at OSU, Brad received several letters of commendation in such fields as anatomy, internal medicine/pediatrics/ family medicine, and radiology; and in February of 1988 he served a clerkship in neurosurgery at The London Hospital in London, England. During his studies at OSU he was also a researcher in the Division of Neurosurgery from 1985 to 1988 under a grant from the Roessler Foundation and worked on developing applications of microcomputer system graphics to stereotactic neurosurgery.

Since his Ohio State Medical licensure in 1988 he has become affiliated with several area hospitals: Riverside Methodist, St. Anns, Grant Medical Center, and Mt. Carmel Medical Center/Mt. Carmel East Hospital. He received his American Board of Neurological Surgery certification in 1997, and in 2002 he was named a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons.

Dr. Mullin is a member of The American Medical Association, Ohio State Medical Association, Landacre Society, Academy of Medicine of Columbus and Franklin County and Joint Section on Disorders of the Spine and Peripheral Nerve. He has published and presented many papers throughout the country on neurological disorders and surgery procedures, particularly spinal surgery. He continues to investigate better methods for disc replacement and has served as a research /investigator of procedures, products and medications for disc surgery patients. In 2002 and 2003 he became KYPHON-Certified and Medtronic Baclofen Pump-Certified.

If occasionally it is necessary to get away from the demands of medicine, Brad seeks physical activities. The gym offers regular relief and for some time now he has been a member of the adult hockey league at Easton Chiller. But more recently scuba diving has become his passion. He takes this sport seriously, traveling as far as Guam to dive at Truk Lagoon or closer to home at the Costa Rica national park at Cocos Island about 300 miles out in the Caribbean to dive with the hammerhead sharks.

Understandably Brad has little time away from the demands of medicine but he and his family enjoy time together and involve themselves as a family with their church, Stoneybrook Methodist in Gahanna.
