John Reed. Reed has a B.S. in English and mathematics from Bowling Green State University (1962), a Master of Education from Wittenberg University (1965), and 120 semester hours beyond the master's degree from The Ohio State University in English and educational curriculum, and from Otterbein College and Ohio Dominican with emphasis in accounting and business courses.

Reed's career spans teaching English and mathematics at such notable schools as Urbana University, Otterbein College, Ohio Department of Youth Services in Circleville and Riverview School for Girls, Eastland Career Center, and New Albany High School.

From 1965 until his retirement in 1993, he taught mathematics at Lincoln High School. He was the high school's mathematics department chair from 1969-1993 and advisor for the Key Club (Kiwanis) from 1966-1986. Reed was notorious for his wit and humor, endearing himself to his mathematics students throughout the years.

Reed is currently an adjunct instructor of business mathematics, the algebras, statistics, pre-calculus, and accounting for Columbus State Community College (1977 to present); a freelance writer in mathematics for Learning Design Associates and Writers, Etc. (1999 to present); and working with Answer Check for Glencoe, a mathematics division of McGraw-Hill (1996 to present).
