XPLOR update

It's been almost a year since XPLOR ended in Spokane (Monica left in March, Meg & Rachel left in April and Tristan left in May). Since then the National Benevolent Association (NBA) XPLOR staff have been seeking God's guidance to determine where the XPLOR program should go next. After prayerfully exploring with God, the NBA XPLOR program is taking a new turn to 3 vision areas for 2021:

- Nurturing an XPLOR Alumni community, with an emphasis on growing a culture of equity
- Launching an innovative young adult peer group, in close partnership with a Disciple constituency ministry
- Visioning and designing a leadership experience by and for Black women of faith

The Spokane XPLOR team met in January and determined that the remaining funds would be split between 2 of our former internship sites (Northwest Fair Housing and Transitions). This program could not have happened in Spokane without the support of Country Homes CC, North Hill CC and the Northern Lights Region. Many different hands were involved in making this program a success! **Thank you** to all those who donated furniture, linens, household items, and food, and supported the XPLOR residents with your prayers and your welcoming presence.
