Creating our new normal

Over the past year we have found ourselves unintentionally creating a new normal of how we do church. At the last board meeting Pastor Chris laid out some of the changes that we are making to our worship service as we continue to move forward. 1) We will continue to invite the congregation to come forward during the time of communion rather than passing trays for both offering and communion. Eventually we will have individuals holding the trays to serve those who come forward. We will have someone who will serve those who are unable to come forward to partake of the elements. 2) In an effort to encourage all who join in with singing hymns during our service, both in person and virtually, we now have an expectation to have a dedicated song leader or the choir lead all the congregational hymns. 3) Coffee hour is returning but is only available when hosts sign up with Janie to do so.

Some other changes you may have started to notice are that we will continue to work towards providing hybrid options for various ministries and programs in the life of the church. This may take the form of making meetings, studies, and other gatherings available via zoom for those who are not able to join in person. We will continue to listen for where there is a need and make adjustments accordingly. Another change you may have noticed in the serving schedule is that we shifted the sanitizer crew over to pick up. As data regarding COVID has shown that contact surfaces are not a high transmission point we have made this shift to utilize these volunteers to straighten up the sanctuary after we use it each week.

For all those who have volunteered to fill new and continuing roles within our congregation, I would like to say thank you. As we have continued to be flexible over the past few years, it is through your service and dedication to the ministries that God calls us to be a part of, that we have been able to continue to declare the Good News of Jesus Christ to our community.
