Those things that prevent us from more easily following the divine. Those things that, through our actions declare to be more important than declaring the gospel.

I invite you all to join me in this journey towards Jerusalem that is filled with opportunities for self reflection, and repentance.

Sanctuary Heat

As many of you are aware by now, we have been without heat in the sanctuary for the entire month of February. This came as a result of some copper thieves that removed many of the components off of our HV/AC unit that supplies the sanctuary. They also took copper from the two smaller AC units that supply the rest of the building. We have been working with our insurance company who have been handling our claim, as well as several local companies to get multiple bids

for restoring our system.

Through this process it has become apparent that the large unit for the sanctuary will need to be replaced, which is taking time to arrive. The two smaller AC units will be repaired. As we have been finding what is needed to restore us to full heat and AC capabilities Bob Hooker has been researching options to help prevent this from happening again.

We thank you all for your patience and flexibility.

This is an area made for the kids and young youth to be in worship, engaging through materials provided for them, and encouraging families to feel welcomed.

You may remember there was the hope to move eight pews from the sanctuary. We paused after the first four four due to a couple hurdles but also to take the time to gain your feedback on the current changes. If we don't like these changes we can put the pews back. But my hope is that we can continue to look for and try new ways to be welcoming to our diverse community.
