Flurries from Chris

Of the main Christian Holidays, Pentecost has and continues to be my favorite. Don't get me wrong I greatly enjoy Christmas Eve and Easter services, but there is something about Pentecost that tips the scales. Perhaps it is the ways in which we celebrate the Holy Spirit descending upon the disciples, as we pay close attention to how the Spirit has taken root within each one of us. Or perhaps it is as we begin recognizing those gifts of God that reside within us come from the Holy Spirit actively moving in and around us. Or even more so, because the movement of the Spirit is evidence of life all around us, from the most powerful gusts of winds to a guiet breath of a little child.

Throughout our scriptures we have come to recognize that the Holy Spirit is used interchangeably with words of "Breath of God" or wind. Those movements of the air that if they ceased would lead to death and decay. If there was no breath in the world the animals of the earth would cease to move. If the wind were to cease, severe drought would arise as the air currents would not bring the rains to the land. Countless plants would cease to reproduce and spread across the land, as seeds that normally are carried on the wind simply drop.

But the thing about the movement of air is that it causes life to be in a constant state of change. Constantly making room for life to flourish. This is highlighted in many of our Pentecost hymns. Hymns that highlight that wherever the Spirit moves there is life but also change. That the spirit calls us out of our comfortable places to continue to make way for the movement of life in the world.

More often than not when the Spirit moves us into moments of change it is not simply for the sake of creating disruptions, but rather to make space for growth. As the Spirit moved through our congregation years ago to recognize the gifts that all members, men and women, had to be elders, it was a change that caused us to get out of our own way to recognize what the spirit was doing in our midst. Or as we find ourselves having discussions about what it may look like to be an Open and Affirming Congregation, it is more about doing the work for us to recognize the systemic barriers we have held up intentionally or not that has caused harm to others.

Whenever we find ourselves moved into seasons of change by the Spirit let us consider for a moment what the purpose of that change may be. Is it change to make us uncomfortable, or is the Spirit causing us to confront systems or traditions that if left in place hold us back from what God would have us be and do here in Spokane.



Some of you may have noticed we had a Boy Scout (Lucas) come and join us in worship a few weeks back. He is a member of troop 130. This is the troop that uses our parking lot the Saturday of Bloomsday weekend for their annual yard sale. As one way of building connections between troop 130 and ourselves he approached Pastor Chris about completing his Eagle Scout project for us. We are in the initial planning stages but at the moment the project will be moving our sound board and visual tech set up from the balcony to the back of the sanctuary, with the goal of being completed by mid-September.

This is one of those projects that has been on our wish list for some time now and fulfills the requirements for an Eagle Scout project. These requirements include, cannot be a project considered regular maintenance, has to involve leadership and planning, and provides a benefit for the organization receiving the project.

Our hope is that as this project is completed we will not have to have a team of people in the balcony each Sunday, and that those overseeing our sound and visual tech devices can more easily participate in the worship service, especially if they are also in the choir.

Sabbatical Planning Underway!

According to Pastor Chris' letter of call when he accepted the calling to be our pastor, he is able to take a 3-month sabbatical every 5 years. During Holy Week, Pastor Chris was approached by the Vice Presidents of the National Benevolent Association (NBA) to be a facilitator of a training for the NBA staff in early May (7-9th). The NBA is the health and social service arm of our denomination, with which we have had a long partnership with going back before we hosted the XPLOR program here in Spokane.

Pastor Chris, has been asked to help lead the staff training where the focus will be on Accessibility and Disability as it pertains to the NBA and its ministries. This is a wonderful opportunity for Pastor Chris as he is able to offer his insights that may prove helpful to our wider church, and as he partners with the other facilitators giving him further insights and knowledge as he prepares to write his book during his sabbatical.


