Flurries from Chris

This month in worship we will be exploring the theme of Imagining Together in a number of ways and I am excited to share my own imaginings. But here is the thing, as I share my own imaginings with you I want you to share yours with the whole congregation.

As we take this time to imagine what is possible, I know some of our initial reactions would be to say, "That would be nice but..." I know I have held some similar thoughts over the years but we have a real and tangible example of God making way for our imaginations to become a reality in our sanctuary.

Several years ago there was a group of us who were willing to put together a list of dream projects. On that list was the desire to move the sound board (and now live stream set up) down from the balcony. At the time we had a number of reasons, 1) there is a noticeable difference in volume in the balcony, and 2) the stairs to the balcony limit who can help with both the sound board and visual tech roles. As we sought to dream we were able to name some of our biggest questions of making it possible, notably how to get power and running the appropriate sound cables to the new location.

Last spring a Boy Scout visited us in worship and approached me about wanting to do an Eagle Scout project and asked if I had any projects that would fit. Rather quickly my mind went over all the projects that the team had dreamed of and the one that was most realistic was to move our sound board and tech setup. It just so happed that he had access to an electrician and enough knowhow to make things happen.

Now we have the sound and tech cabinets on the main level of the sanctuary, making way for additional volunteers to serve, but also making it easier for me to utilize visual aids during my sermon. I recognize this is likely just the beginning of recognizing what is now possible because of the completion of this project.

While this project was on a dream list for some years it was through the relationships that we have built with the Boy Scouts that made this project possible. Relationships that God continues to encourage us to pursue, whether it is with AA, Ukrainian Baptist Church, and the Boy Scouts, or other organizations that may arise in the future. Imagine what is possible if we open ourselves to the possibilities that God places in front of in the form of possible friendly relationships.


