We were able to collect; 10.5 pounds of laundry detergent, 119 bars of soap, , 28 tubes of toothpaste, 32 bottles of shampoo/conditioner, 6 bottles of moisturizing lotion, 13 toothbrushes, 12 packages of dental floss, 1 jumbo bag of cotton balls, 5 packages of tampons, 5 packages of fabric softener, 13 sticks of deodorant, 24 rolls of toilet paper, 2 bottles of laundry detergent, 2 packages of cleaning cloths, 9 bottles of hand sanitizer, 8 bottles of hand lotion, 18 day passes for the bus, \$120 in gift cards.
