Dream Makers Youth Foundation is a non-profit [501(c)(3)] organization founded in 2004 that provides community-based educational, recreational, and therapeutic services to preschool through high school-aged children with special needs throughout Metropolitan Atlanta. Children with special needs are defined as children and adolescents with various disabilities including, but not limited to: Asperger's Syndrome, Autism, Down Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, Traumatic Brain Injuries, Mild to Moderate Intellectual Disabilities, and Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder.

This program encourages children with special needs to actively adjust to their disabilities by providing them with recreational opportunities and sports training.

Foundations4Learning Tutorial Progam

Since 2005, Dream Makers Youth Foundation has provided tutorial services to elementary school students with special needs residing in Metropolitan Atlanta who are having or have a high probability of having difficulties in school based on their diagnoses. We provide the extra assistance they need to become more independent and successful in their school environment.

- In 2008, we transitioned from a home -based to school-based program and now utilize students from Clark Atlanta University to provide tutoring services
- The program is currently integrated into Peyton Forest Elementary School (Atlanta Public Schools)
- Over 200 students have been served, and all have demonstrated improvement in homework, grades, and standardized test scores
- Plan to expand to additional schools



<mark>Sc</mark>hool2Work Program

Although the availability of employment has improved since the inception of the Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990, there are still limited opportunities for individuals with disabilities to become gainfully employed. To address this need, Dream Makers Youth Foundation will offer a school-to-work program to high school-aged children with special needs who reside in the Metro



Atlanta area. The program is designed for those who are interested in obtaining employment, but require assistance to effectively transition into the workforce.

Dream Makers Youth Foundation hosts several events throughout the year to provide opportunities for our children to engage in recreational activities, increase community exposure of our organization and the abilities and needs of special needs childres, and to raise money for our programs.

Celebrity Wheelchair Basketball Jam

Since 2004, we have hosted our annual Celebrity Wheelchair Basketball Jam (CWBJ) - a star-studded, fast-paced game of wheelchair basketball where local celebrities, often using sports chairs for the first time, play with and against disabled athletes.

DMYF's Celebrity Wheelchair Basketball Jam is their premier fundraising event, with over 350 attendees each year!













Bring the Heat 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament

Able-bodied and wheelchair divisions are featured at the Bring the Heat 3-on-3 tournament that exposes our community to the abilities, not disabilities, of wheelchair athletes since 2005. In 2009, Dream Makers teamed up with HoopAtlanta to recruit, organize and run the tournament's wheelchair division.





<mark>Chasing the Dream 5K Road Race</mark>

In 2011, DMYF will host our first 5K road race to increase community awareness about the abilities of disabled athletes and to raise money to help make the dreams of one of our disabled youth come true. We're excited to host the inaugural

race on August 13, 2011 in Smyrna, Georgia.











Casino Night and Auction

Hosted annually in November, the Casino Night and Auction is an elegant, black-tie affair, where DMYF supporters make contributions while playing casino games and bid on live and silent auction items.



Family Movie Night

Hosted monthly, families with children with special needs can enjoy recent family-friendly movies in a theatre-like environment, with a concession stand...and no stigmas attached.

Parent Empowerment Series

In April 2009, we began hosting our Parent Empowerment Series during Family Movie Night, where we feature speakers with expertise in areas of concern for parents of children with special needs. The sessions have focused on topics including school advocacy, behavior modification, diet options and coping strategies.
