FORGOTTEN DAYS


And after (Jesus) had said these things, He was lifted up while they were looking on, and a cloud received Him out of their sight. Acts 1:9

Christmas, Epiphany, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Resurrection, Pentecost: these seven days garner a great deal of attention in the church calendar. Likewise, New Year Day, Valentine Day, St. Patrick's Day, Cinco de Mayo, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Halloween, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, and New Year's Eve (among others) offer the opportunity for celebrations of secular origin.

May 31, 2019 will be what I like to call a "forgotten" day of the church's observation of important events. It is the date this year when we mark the Ascension of Christ. We profess in our creeds that "He ascended into heaven." If the event was considered significant in the composition and compilation of these doctrinal statements, why is it largely ignored? For one thing, it always occurs on a Thursday. Scripture reveals that the ascension occurred forty days after His resurrection (Acts 1:3). It is difficult to gather even the most faithful believers on something other than a Sunday. Even Maundy Thursday and Good Friday have become more sparsely attended in recent years...so much so that many churches no longer hold worship services on these days. As a second reason for its "forgotten" status, businesses have not commercialized this holiday. Most secular and the most popular Christian holidays determinately encourage the celebrants to spend their money. The entertainment industry benefits greatly through the sale of advertising the holidays which are profitable to business, therefore many remember to "celebrate" those events.

Where does the Ascension fit in our theology? It is the current "experience" of the church. Christ Jesus has ascended to and sits at the right hand of God until the Day when He will return. As He ascended, His disciples "were gazing intently into the sky" (Acts 1:10). Two angels spoke to those gathered believers the promise that one day "He will come in just the same way" (Acts 1:11). With that news in mind, the disciples returned to Jerusalem and "with one mind were continually devoting themselves to prayer" (Acts 1:14). May this final statement be our moniker until the Day of the Lord! May we be a praying assembly, gathering together to encourage one another as we see that Day approaching!


First School And Day Care



WHY DO WE...?

... WORSHIP ON SUNDAYS

If the Ten Commandments includes the precept to "remember the Sabbath day," then why do we worship on Sundays?

The Creation narrative relates that God completed the "work" of creation in six days, and on the seventh day, He "rested." Thus, those who worshipped the True God observed His command and kept the seventh day as a sabbath, a day of rest. However, with the resurrection of Christ on the first day of the week, everything changed. Sunday became the Lord's Day, a day of celebration and remembrance of the work of salvation which Jesus accomplished for us. We assemble (or at least we **SHOULD** assemble) for worship and encouragement on the first day of the week for four reasons:

- 1) Jesus appeared to His disciples as the risen Savior on Sunday (John 20:1);
- 2) The Holy Spirit descended on the disciples of Jesus on a Sunday [the fiftieth day after Passover] (Acts 2:1);
- 3) As on the first day of creation when God created light and separated it from darkness, so we worship on Sunday (the first day of the week) to celebrate the light of the Gospel which delivers and separates from the darkness of sin (John 1:1-18, 2 Corinthians 4:3-6);
- 4) The early church gathered on the first day of the week (1 Corinthians 16:2).

The joy of the Resurrection Worship which we enjoyed on April 21st should and can be the full experience of our gathering together. All that is required for a repeat of our celebration is for you to come. Looking forward to seeing you again soon!
