Entrusted Connections Ministry (ECM) ministers at the Prince William County Adult Detention Center in Manassas, Virginia to the Women In New Direction (WIND), a faith-based program. While there offenders often indicate they have no place to go upon release and no support system to help them re-adjust after being incarcerated. God revealed a need within the Prince William County Community and in accordance with Hebrews 13:16 *“But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased”*, ECM established Entrusted Connections Life House (ECLH). ECM has also partnered with RESET 180, a program that supports victims of human trafficking, who also qualify for residency at the ECLH.

ECM has a heart for ex-offenders and victims of human trafficking. ECLH's primary purpose is to provide transitional housing support in a Christian environment for these communities of women.

OUR MISSION

Entrusted Connections Life House (ECLH) offers hope, grace and support for persons seeking new beginnings that are exiting penal systems and other institutions of correction and restoration in a Christian environment.

WHAT IS ECLH

The ECLH (Entrusted Connection Life House) is an entity under the Entrusted Connections Ministry a 501c(3) organization dedicated to providing transitional housing in a Christian environment for ex-offenders recently released from incarceration and victims of human trafficking. Residents can stay in our program for up to two years. Throughout their stay, we provide temporary housing, mentoring, life skills training, counseling, transitional assistance, substance abuse recovery programs and volunteer management. We cover the most significant barriers that recently paroled women and female human trafficking victims face. We also assist with job placement.

ECLH OBJECTIVES

- To provide a safe environment for ECLH residents exiting the penal systems and other institutions of correction and restoration.
- To equip ECLH residents with life skills necessary for successful transitions.
- To ascertain, develop and mature ECLH residents with life balance skills.
- To design a matriculation process to meet ECLH resident goals.
- To provide resources such as job training/ job search assistance for employment opportunities.
- To assist in the spiritual growth and development of each resident of the ECLH. All residents are required to participate in daily study of Proverbs and prayer, weekly bible studies and church attendance.

ECLH HOUSING

OPPORTUNITY SERVICE

Housing advocacy to help our clients plan for and secure permanent housing. Housing Opportunity Services include but are not limited to application support services, available housing listings, and housing resource referrals.

ECLH LIFE SKILLS TRAINING

Partnering with community programs to enhance the ECLH residents ability to achieve a more abundant life. These life skills will include but are not limited to, financial management, credit repair, personal care, health and wellness, time management skills and interpersonal skills.

ECLH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

On-site workforce development program designed to help ECLH residents obtain employment. Workforce development skills will include but are not limited to resume writing, interviewing techniques, dressing for success and work ethics.
