| Bible Memory Award | Successfully recite the assigned memory passage (including reference) to a club leader with no more than two helps for the entire passage. | Weekly award Semester award for quoting the memory passage at least 12 weeks of the semester Yearly award when both semester awards have been earned | Clubbers may miss up to three weekly Bible Memory Awards each semester and still receive the semester Bible Memory Award. |
| Attendance Award | Attend weekly meetings. | Weekly award Semester award for attendance at 12 or more meetings for the semester | Clubbers may miss up to three weekly meetings each semester and still receive the semester Attendance Award. |
| Barracks Duty Award | Complete the weekly Barracks Duty assignment. | Weekly award | If the Barracks Duty for any particular week is not appropriate for the child, the parent may assign a substitute job. |
| Field Duty Service Award See next page. | Complete at least two Field Duty service activities each semester. | Semester award (Award coins the week the duty is reported.) | |



A **Field Duty** is an activity that serves **those outside your household.** It must be either service oriented or evangelistic in nature. Some examples of acceptable Field Duties include:

Passing out no fewer than 10 tracts

Bringing a visitor to a church service or club meeting

Helping to fix a meal for a family in need

Visiting someone in a nursing home or hospital

Singing or playing an instrument in a church service

Participating in a church work day

Participating in a fundraising event for a ministry

Helping an elderly neighbor or friend with yard work or household tasks

To receive credit for completing a Field Duty, fill out the form on the last page of the Journal week in which it was completed and have one of your parents sign it.



^{*}Clubber receives five FrontLine coins on the night he reports a completed Field Duty. Three Field Duties may be awarded each semester.

One FrontLine Coin is worth ten FrontLine Tickets

FrontLine Coins and Tickets may be turned in at the Base Exchange (BX) to "buy" a variety of useful and interesting items. Each club will visit the Base Exchange on a rotating schedule (usually every four weeks).

UNIFORM



If you are a first year clubber (fourth grade), attach your award pins to your LEFT collar. If you are a second year clubber (fifth grade), attach your award pins to your RIGHT collar.

To attach first semester awards: Insert the Faithfulness pin (torch) through the hole in the blue Attendance disk. Place pin and disk 1/2" from the short bottom edge of the collar and 1/2" from the long outer edge of the collar. Insert the Bible Memory pin through the hole in the yellow Field Duty disk. Place pin and disk 1/8" above the Faithfulness/ Attendance set and 1/2" from the long outer edge of the collar.

To attach second semester awards: Combine pins and disks as described above. Add the pin sets to the collar, placing them 1/8" from each other and 1/2" from the collar edge.

GETTING STARTED

All Christians, young and old, grow in their Christian lives by reading their Bibles and praying every day. One of the goals of FrontLine Clubs is to help you develop a daily habit of Bible study and prayer. The Club Journals are designed to help accomplish this goal.

Each Club Journal is divided into fifteen weeks of material. Each week of material includes a title page, a prayer list, five daily pages, and a Duty Checklist.

Title Page

The Title Page for each week includes the lesson number, lesson name, memory passage for the week, and a service assignment. The memory passage will be referred to daily and must be memorized before the next club meeting in order for you to receive your Faithfulness Award. The Barracks Duty must also be done sometime before the next club meeting. If the Barracks Duty given is not appropriate for you, one of your parents may substitute something else in its place. This box must be signed by one of your parents in order for you to receive credit for doing the assignment.

Prayer Chart

The prayer chart found on the back of each Title Page is provided as a tool rather than an assignment you must do for credit. Fill out your prayer chart each week and refer to it during your prayer time.

Daily Pages

Each week includes five daily assignments. The assignments must be done on different days of the week in order for you to earn credit for doing them. Each assignment includes instructions for memorizing the memory passage, a variety of activities to reinforce and teach the weekly lesson, and a reminder to spend time in prayer. At the end of each daily assignment is a box for one of your parents to sign and date, confirming that you have completed the work.

Duty Checklist

The Duty Checklist at the end of each week provides a place for your club leader to record what you accomplished. There is also space to record a Field Duty, if one was completed.


