in the sewers of Russia and Ukraine. The ministry has grown to its work with street kid centers, orphanages, widows, and the poor.




Michael was a senior pastor for 15 years and taught college writing for almost 15 years. He has published over 80 magazine and news articles and 12 books.

Our organization is small, but our hearts are hearing the heart of our Father. Michael Wetzel began our ministry in 2003 after a trip to Russia. On Christmas day he visited a drop-in center for kids who were living on the streets. They were dirty, smelly, and a bit rambunctious. Yet they craved the love of a father and mother.

After this trip the Lord put it on Michael's heart to

start Shepherd's Purse. Each new step seems to be planned for us as God leads us on a remarkable journey. We have a great board that meets on a regular basis and



many volunteers who donate their time for the kids.

We are a *registered non-profit*. We survive on donations from individuals, churches, and others who are touched by this tremendous need.

Ukraine was our first focus but supporters helped us build a small orphanage in India for 25 boys and staff. We fully supported it for ten years. Now we re-focus on Ukraine.

We are not big but Jesus might say, "You gave one coat, one cup of water, one meal, and found lodging for those who were forgotten. You did that for me."

What Have We Done?

We started out working with kids living on the streets and sleeping in sewers. We then began to partner with small ministries which get little to no help from other sources but work with the kids on a regular basis.



Eventually we gravitated to our partners as they ministered in orphanages. This is where most street kids ended up. We then began branching out to also help

widows and the poor. Then a couple of years ago God also directed us to build an orphanage in India where we came to know Joshua Nag, and his fami-

ly. They were working with orphans in their area and had great vision to spread the gospel on the forgotten children. Eventually their vision also grew to the needy in their area. At that point we were able to refocus



more of our efforts back on our Ukraine partners and the many needs there.
