but others also come to think of us as being wise and spiritually mature. But if we talk about God in such a way that the true emptiness of our hearts is concealed, either from others or ourselves, we are doing something that is exceedingly dangerous. As the painful realities that could draw us toward a real relationship with God are buried beneath a blanket of fine religious words, we may discover that our own verbiage has become our greatest hindrance in moving toward God. Endlessly repeating the truth about Him will have become a substitute for dealing with the truth about ourselves.

We are perhaps familiar with the biblical warnings against words-only religion. Paul, for example, warned about "vain" or idle "talkers" (*Tit. 1:10*), indicating that such people "profess that they know God, but by their works they deny Him" (*Tit. 1:16*). And Jesus Himself spoke sternly on the subject: "This people honoreth me with their lips; But their heart is far from me" (*Mat. 15:8*). But are "vain talkers" just professional imposters and intentional hypocrites? Surely these texts have a wider application. They are a warning also to those who have slipped *carelessly* into the assumption that if their words are good, then that is all they need to be concerned about.

Intentional or not, hypocrisy is a very serious matter. The soundness of our faith involves more than the sound of our words. "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father who is in heaven" (*Mat. 7:21*).
