

The Revised Common lectionary tells us what scriptures to use every Sunday in worship. Most mainline denominations use this as it connects Christian worship across the United States and beyond. The RCL runs in three year cycles concentrating each year on a Synoptic Gospel: Matthew, Mark, or Luke. We are just finishing year A.

What the RCL is lacking is centering women's experiences in the scripture. So, beginning in Advent, we will be using a new lectionary for the year. This lectionary will feature stories of women in the scripture and tie them together much like the RCL does for Old and New Testament stories.

My hope is that by changing it up we will be introduced to stories we haven't heard in a while or maybe ever before. It's always good to look at scripture through a new lens!

Greetings to our HTLC community!

It's been a wonderful summer, with our special worship service and BBQ in the park, pub with the pastor, swimming party, college students blessing and send-off, school backpack donations for local children, assembling donation kits for people in need, and more. We are looking forward to upcoming activities including a booth at the San Carlos Art & Wine Faire, and blessing of the animals service Oct. 8. Additionally, the congregation approved HTLC council spending up to \$80,000 to replace the damaged roofs at the end of their lifespan for Beilstein Hall and the parsonage. This work will be done in the second half of October! We look forward to everyone prayerfully considering how they can assist with the building fund to help cover the costs.

Additional notes from the September Council meeting are as follows:

- At September council meeting, accepted the August Treasurer's report, with year-to-date receipts of \$148,997 received against expenses of \$150,994
- Discussed the plan for managing the roof replacement by San Carlos Roofing, with Rick Gilmore to manage the project for buildings and grounds - thank you Rick!!
- Discussed the plan for the capital campaign, with the goal of raising \$20,000-\$40,000 with two purposes - to fund the portion of roof replacement that is not already in-hand, and, to replenish the emergency contingency fund of \$20,000 that we're using on the roof. Thanks to Anne for leading this team!!
- Approved benevolence distribution of \$750 to Lutheran Disaster Response with special designation for US wildfire victims

I always think it's fun and thought-provoking to read various versions of some of our favorite Bible texts, and wanted to share the International Standard Version of Matthew 11:28-30.

Roof update!

San Carlos Roofing will begin the Beilstein Hall and Parsonage roof replacement project in Mid-October. The project is expected to take about two week to complete. A big thank you to the whole congregation for approving and supporting this important infrastructure improvement!

Rev. Jeff Johnson Elected Bishop of the Sierra Pacific Synod

Jeff R. Johnson, Berkeley, Calif., was elected Sept. 17 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Sierra Pacific Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during a live synod assembly.

Johnson was elected on the fifth ballot, with 226 votes. The Rev. John Keuhner, pastor of Unity Lutheran Church of South San Francisco and bridge pastor of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church of San Mateo, Calif., received 168 votes.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of University Lutheran Chapel of Berkeley and as a member of the Spiritual Care Team at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, Berkeley, since 2013. Previously he served as pastor of First United Lutheran Church in San Francisco (1990-1999), as a mission developer for Lutheran Lesbian and Gay Ministries in San Francisco (1990-1995), as HIV education director for Lutheran Social Services of Northern California (1988-1989), as assistant night minister for San Francisco Night Ministry (1987-1988), and was an intern at the Lutheran Office of Public Policy and at First English Lutheran Church in Sacramento (1986-1987).

Johnson received his Bachelor of Arts in history and Bachelor of Arts in German from California Lutheran University, Thousand Oaks, in 1984, and his Master of Divinity from Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in 1988. Johnson was ordained in 1990.
