We will be assembling the meals on Sunday, March 24th after the coffee hour is cleaned up. All help is greatly appreciated.



Rise Against Hunger

The Outreach Committee is once again partnering with other local organizations to participate in the Rise Against Hunger drive. This international hunger relief program provides packaged meals for those in need due to natural disasters, political unrest, and other crises. Locally, our teams from area churches and groups raise funds to purchase the food supplies and participate in a work day to prepare the packaged meals (September 28 this year; you will hear more about that later). Last year, the plate offerings, funds raised from a youth group supper, and the Outreach Committee's contribution totaled nearly \$3000. We hope to exceed that this year.

We hope that you will join us in this very worthwhile cause. Throughout Lent, envelopes will be available in the pews. Checks may be written to St. James' Church, with "Rise Against Hunger" in the memo line. The Outreach Committee has voted to match funds collected up to a total of \$2000.
