Meditate on this Scripture verse "Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive". (Corinthians 3:13).

No church is perfect, but we can make positive stives to redirect our judgment of others and our focus of what is wrong by beautifying what's right. This must be done with a spirit of forbearance that seeks to build up, not tear down.

COVID did great damage to all churches. Many could not withstand the decline in attendance and support and have closed their doors. Those that have survived realize that it is serving two different segments of churchgoers – connected and virtual.



I look forward to sharing worship with you.


