As I write this letter, I am only days away from going on the Nicaragua Medical Mission. Our team of 14, including Bryn Mancarella and Cindy Bonville from our church will team up with a very dedicated and enthusiastic team that will provide medicines, food, seeds, and love to the people who live in areas surrounding Managua and Jinotega.



I believe that the greatest things we can do in life are to love God and love one another - just like Jesus did. That type of love is a deep, sacrificial love. That is the type of love we hope to bring to the people of Nicaragua. Please pray for us.

It's a simple idea that provides thousands of dollars to save lives.


Each year the money raised from the Campaign helps support those facing unplanned pregnancies and their babies through the ministry of Care Net.
