Happy Easter!

In a recent New York Times Opinion published on the first day of Passover, author Shalom Auslander penned that "In this time of war and violence, of oppression and suffering, I propose we pass over something else: God".

Satan was surely doing his happy dance when this article not only reached nearly 878,000 New York Times readers, but received 24-hour news coverage on virtually every national news network.

Should we be concerned? My answer is **NO**.

Yes, evil is very active in our society. Evil is active in our neighborhoods, on our streets, and in our schools. Evil can be found anywhere that we might be looking to find it. It can influence and even destroy lives. In my career I have seen it face-to-face.

Jesus wants each of us to walk with Him in peace and transform our lives and the lives of others with the power and promise of the Resurrection.


Consider this revision in Auslander's Opinion "In this time of war and violence, of oppression and suffering, I propose we submit to the will of God knowing that good will overcome evil".


