The Beautiful One He had no beauty or majesty... By his wounds we are healed



Isaiah 53:2, 5

For more than 130 years, the Eiffel Tower has stood majestically over the city of Paris, a symbol of architectural brilliance and beauty. The city proudly promotes the tower as a key element of its magnificence.

As it was being built, however, many people thought little of it. Famous French writer Guy De Maupassant, for example, said it had a "a ridiculous thin shape like a factory chimney." He couldn't see its beauty.

Those of us who love Jesus and have entrusted our hearts to Him as our Savior count Him as beautiful for who He is and what he's dome for us. Yet the prophet Isaiah penned these words: "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him" (53:2).

But the towering majesty of what He did for us is the truest, purest from of beauty that humans will ever know and experience. He "took up our pain and bore our suffering" (v.4). He was "pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed" (v.5).

We'll never know anyone as beautiful-as majestic-as the one who suffered for us on the cross, taking the unspeakable punishment of our sins upon Himself.

That's Jesus. The Beautiful One. Let's look to Him and live.

Robert Todd Lincoln lived under the extensive shadow of his father, beloved American president Abraham Lincoln. Long after his father's death, Robert's identity was engulfed by this father's overwhelming presence. Lincoln's close friend, Nicholas Murray Butler, wrote that Robert often said, "no one wanted me for secretary of war; they wanted Abraham Lincoln's son. No one wanted me for minister to England; they wanted Abraham Lincoln's son. No one wanted me for president of the Pullman Company; they wanted Abraham Lincoln's son."

Such frustration isn't limited to the children of the famous. We all are familiar with the feeling of not being valued for who we are. Yet nowhere is the depth of our value more evident than in the way God loves us.

The apostle Paul recognized us for who we were in our sins, and for who we become in Christ. He wrote, "at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly" (Romans 5:6). God loves us because of who we are-even at our worst! Paul wrote, "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (v.8). God values us so much that He allowed His Son to go to the cross on our behalf.

Who are we? We're god's beloved children. Who could ask for more?

PRAYER MISSION AUGUST - HOSPICE

The goal is to provide comfort care for persons facing the end of life.

The medical and staff members seek to bring symptoms of the illness under control. The care is most frequently administered in the patient's home but with the addition of the Siegenthaler Center, this hospice now has four units for more intensive care in a setting which is modern, bright, and attractive. There is a kitchen for residents to meet with their families and make or warm up a dinner prepared elsewhere. There are also lounge and recreational areas and various nursing care facilities.

In-home clients receive a visit from a nurse every two weeks with more frequent attention as necessary or requested. Other services are provided as requested, e.g. counseling for patient or family, and a visit from the chaplain. The patient is "captain of the ship" which means they receive the kind of care they desire as opposed to being in a less personal and medically driven environment.
