In 1 Thessalonians 4:1-12 Paul states a plea for purity and explains how to have an orderly life. He states in verses 1 & 2 “Finally then, brethren, we urge and exhort in the Lord Jesus that you should abound more and more, just as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God; for you know what commandments we gave you through the Lord Jesus.” Many times in Scripture Paul shows he was a man with faults. He said I do the things I don’t want to do and so forth and he said that I am the chief sinner. Many other Apostles and other religious leaders did not show this humility and transparency. Because Paul showed who he was as a person and was transparent, I believe when he used his Apostolic authority it carried much weight. In other words, in verse 2 he is stating that he was speaking by the authority of Christ which means, we need to listen. Listen to what? First, what the will of God is and secondly, how to be in the will of God. Have you ever asked what the will of God is? I would like to use Scripture to direct us and see what Paul and King David have to say about it.

First of all, we have to ask, can we live in the will of God? The will of God is to live, sanctified. Sanctified means to be set apart or declare holy. This is what Jesus prayed for His disciples in John 17:6-19. In verse 17, Jesus said, “Sanctify them by Your truth. For Your Word is truth.” So interpreting Scripture with Scripture, we see that 1 Thessalonians 5:3 is saying the will of God is knowing and living in the Word which is the truth. In verses 3-8 it then gives how to live sanctified. Paul is saying the will of God is being separate of the world. In verse 7 he explains sanctification even more. We are called to live in holiness. How do we do that? He says we do this by knowing His truth. Verse 8, Paul again states this is not him saying it but it is God. We as the body of Christ must know His truth. As John 17:17 says, “His Word is truth”. We need to be in His Word and know His Word.

We have to know that wanting to know His will and wanting to know His word starts in the mind. In verses 9-12 of 1 Thessalonians, Paul is telling the church of Thessalonica that it is important to keep working for the Gospel. Many in the church were waiting for the last days and stopped doing what they were called to do. The will of God is to be in the world but not of the world. The will of God is living in the truth and sharing that truth. The will of God will always involve salvation and sanctification. Again this is not by Paul’s authority but Gods. If the church is not sharing the Word to lead people to salvation and teaching the Word through discipleship that the church is not being the Church.

So, how do we know the will of God. In Psalm 37:3-6 David said Trust in the LORD, and do good; Dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness. Delight yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the LORD, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass. He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, And your justice as the noonday.” In this, David shares a truth that scares us. What is it? Many might say that if I trust in God He will give me whatever I want. That is only half the truth. Remember that the will of God is that we know the truth. When we know the truth we will trust in the Lord and do good (vs. 3). When we trust in the Lord and do good, God implants into us His desires. What does that mean? Our desires become His desires. Our will becomes His will. Then God brings that will to pass (vs. 5-6). In other words, it is not our evil or selfish desires that He will bring to pass. As we seek the truth he plants in us His Word. As we understand His Word we understand His desires. As we know more about Him we want to please Him. As we seek to please Him he plants in us desires to do His will. As he plants those desires in us we desire to see them come to pass. As we desire to see them come to pass He will bring them to pass.

It starts with wanting to know the truth. As we seek the truth we will find it and we will want to be set apart “sanctified”. When we are set apart we will have joy. This is what Jesus was saying in John 15. As we abide in Him which means live in His Word, we will be set apart for His purpose and our joy will be full.

So many times when we are not in His Word our desire becomes things of this world. In a sense we like to tell Jesus to take the wheel. Jesus does not want to take the wheel; he sent the Spirit to be our helper. Our Father wants us to listen to His still small voice and to seek His word to know His will. He wants us to hold on to the wheel and willingly go where He is directing us, say what He tells us to say and do what He tells us to do. When our will is His will we will go where He goes and our joy will be full. Make it a point today to get in His Word and seek His will.




From Pastor Kevin Smith


