The June 2021 Consistory meeting was held. The year has been moving fast. Consistory had an extensive talk about Sunday service guidelines and what we can start easing up on and what we feel should be kept in place. We updated the guidelines and sent them out to the congregation. As things improve regarding Covid-19 within the state,

we will continue to review our guidelines and update, as needed. If you have any questions or concerns about our guidelines, please feel free to reach out to any member of Consistory. A more recent update is about capacity of the Sanctuary. We have decided to increase the percentage to 50% which is about 125 people. Again, as things improve, we are hoping by the end of summer, we will be at 100%. Consistory has approved moving forward with some outdoor improvements in landscaping with the help of some recent donations. We will be working on the removal of all the old trees, bushes, rocks and edging in front of the Sanctuary and replacing with new. This is in the very beginning phase, but with the refinishing of the front doors, the front of the church really is in need of some freshening up. As we move into summer, other items have been completed, such as the removal of storm windows on the Sanctuary and all boilers have been shut down for the season. The Sunday School room has been getting some freshening up and, by the end of summer, we hope to be ready for Sunday School. We will be having a rummage sale this fall. Consistory has given the ok to start preparing for rummage now. With the amount of rummage this time around, it gives members more time to sort and prepare. Tables have been set up and members have already started to sort. Unfortunately, it has been decided no food will be sold this time around. Much of the space downstairs will be used to help space the rummage out for social distancing.

"For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." (Galatians 5:1 NRSV)

As we approach Independence Day, what verse could be more appropriate for us to focus on? We might ask, however, from what did Christ free us? After all, slavery as a social institution continued for conturing offer the time of Christ, and in

social institution continued for centuries after the time of Christ, and in Colossians (chapter 3, verse 22), Paul tells slaves to obey their earthly masters in everything! So from what does Christ free us? The answer is simple: sin. In John 8:34 Jesus says, "...Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin." And Acts gives us the final answer, "... by this Jesus everyone who believes is set free from all those sins from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses." (Acts 13:39 NRSV) Jesus, through his death and Resurrection, frees us from sin and its slavery.

So we are freed from the slavery of sin and the Law of Moses. Does this leave us totally unanchored, without any connection to a way to order our behavior? Of course not. Scripture lays out Jesus' teachings through the Sermon on the Mount and the rest of the Gospels, Acts and Romans, and the epistles of Paul, but Jesus himself gives us the simple answer, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:29-30 NRSV) In serving Jesus we find our freedom.
