

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our Gospel this Sunday we hear a beautiful and powerful account of the Lord's mercy. A sinful woman approaches Jesus as he dines with one of the Pharisees and, seeming to anticipate His gift of mercy and forgiveness, she shows her love by bathing and anointing his feet as he reclines at table. The woman receives the Lord's forgiveness, having opened herself to Him in a very vulnerable way. There is an important lesson and reminder here for us: in order for the Lord's mercy and forgiveness to truly reach our hearts, we must allow ourselves to be vulnerable and open our hearts to Him. This is exactly what is meant to happen in the confessional when we encounter the Lord Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Too often, out of fear or shame or embarrassment, we don't open our hearts to the Lord and instead, we try to invent some other way to be forgiven. God's plan for our forgiveness is always the best - in the coming weeks wouldn't it be great to experience this same Divine Mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

We are blessed to have Deacon Allen Greene with us this Sunday at the 11:00am Mass, to serve at the altar and preach for the first time here since his ordination to the permanent diaconate. It was a great blessing to have Allen with us for his parish internship and we look forward to celebrating with him this Sunday and praying for him as he begins his parish ministry at St. Agnes in Catonsville.

We wish all of our dads a very happy and blessed Father's Day this Sunday! We will be offering a special blessing for all of our dads at the Masses this weekend, asking our heavenly Father to guide and direct them to be the best earthly fathers they can be.

Finally, thank you to everyone who came out and joined us for our Parish Picnic last Sunday evening. It was a record crowd for us and I'm so grateful to the entire team that made it possible: our Pastoral Council who provided the leadership and planning under Karen Potter (assisted by John, Barbara, Kathy and Will), all of those

GETTING TO KNOW OUR CATHOLIC SAINTS: Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher (+1535) Feast: June 22

Fisher and More share a feast day, as they bore common witness, giving their lives within weeks of each other. John Fisher was a priest (and a Cardinal when he died), Thomas More, a layman with a wife and four children. They were perhaps the most highly respected men in England, which explains King Henry VIII's eagerness to have them take the Oath approving his divorce and remarriage contrary to the judgment of the Pope.



More had held many high posts including Lord Chancellor;

Fisher was both Bishop of Rochester and Chancellor of the University of Cambridge. Both men were brilliant scholars. More, a friend of Erasmus, insisted, contrary to custom, upon instructing his wife and children personally in literature and science. They were also exemplary Christians; More earned the description "a man for all seasons," as he was the perfect gentleman in every circumstance. Fisher had been spiritual guide of the royal family before the present king, leading them to greater charity and mercy. Both, however, were imprisoned in the Tower of London, where they endured both harsh treatment and subtle entreaties, without giving in. Fisher was the only bishop in England to distinguish himself thus. They were beheaded in 1535 but only canonized four hundred years later, by Pope Pius XII.
