Despite having to cancel 31 of the 33 mission trips that were on MOST Ministries' schedule this year because of the COVID-19 pandemic, our staff and Board of Directors have not been deterred from our shared responsibility to further MOST's mission. In fact, we are making plans to expand the reach of the Ministry and increase its impact in the mission field after we are allowed to resume sending teams – which we hope and pray will be in 2021.

Rather than allow ourselves to get discouraged and become fearful about what we could not control as the pandemic unpredictably continued, our staff has: continued to pray together each morning, seeking God's guidance and blessings on the Ministry and our Ministry partners; and focused our efforts on doing whatever we can do to keep the Ministry operating smoothly, stay financially healthy, and remain poised to send volunteer teams to serve in other countries as soon as international borders and travel

This year MOST Ministries has applied for more grant monies than ever before in order to reduce the cost for individuals to participate on a MOST mission team. We are changing many of our internal processes to become a more efficient and effective ministry. We are improving the curriculum for several of our current onthe-field mission projects that were in need of a partial overhaul. We are exploring new types of service projects that could make a greater impact on the lives of hundreds of impoverished families and individuals who are marginalized and have no social safety net. We are also reaching out to more pastors and missionaries working in areas of the world where a MOST team has never been or hasn't been in a long time -- so we can help them expand their church through acts of service and sharing the saving gospel of Jesus Christ with people in their communities.

So, as you can see, the pandemic has not stopped the work and goal of MOST Ministries to "impact the world for Christ through short-term missions." One of our Board members recently sent me these encouraging words from scripture:

However, we as children of God have continued taking the message across to those who don't know the Lord yet. It's been a challenge since we have not been able to fellowship. So we have used social media as our main source of evangelism. We have also assisted families with the little we have which also makes an impact. I would like you all to pray for our finances since it has been hard to be without, but we trust in the Lord that all will be well. We want to thank you all for the moments we shared together while in Belize. Our people were impacted by the assistance you all gave us as well. We miss each and every one of you and I hope one day we can cross paths. God bless you all and may God continue protecting you.

Grace alone; Faith alone; Word alone. This is the verse of the week for my community. By using Facebook, WhatsApp, and YouTube, I am able to hold Divine service every Sunday and Bible studies four times a week. I al-



so hold a live prayer every day at 9pm. There is mercy help where every week, 30 families received a bag of food worth \$25 USD. Every month, the families received a bag of food worth \$50 USD (see the pictures below of the families who received food). No face-to-face services are allowed due to government regulations and there is a curfew every night. May God continue to bless these ministries.

Dang Thaweesin (Thailand)

With Thailand on lockdown because of the coronavirus, parents living in poverty have no way to feed their children since they have no job, no income, and no savings. If they cannot work, their families don't eat. Life is totally changed. During this pandemic, Concordia Welfare and Education Foundation's (CWEFT) team has changed the day care to be a canteen, to cook, serve and reach out to the children, mothers, and families. CWEFT's team has packed boxed lunches daily and delivers them to the kids. In 83 days, CWEFT shared 16,600 meals which were

distributed to over 2,500 people within 11 slum communities. We are also providing weekly care packages for the children's families. Each package includes education supplies so the kids can keep up with their schooling during the lockdown, medicine, masks, and soap. CWEFT has distributed 1,800 care packages. In addition, we made sure all the children have cloth face masks and have been taught about proper health and hygiene practices to prevent catching the virus. We connect with family members, residents, and community leaders to show the love of Jesus and our care for them and their neighbors. We thank God for allowing CWEFT to continue to be the hands and feet of Jesus to bring COVID-19 crisis relief to the people of the Bang Na Community.
